



## Statuette of Isis, Standing with Feathered Crown

Ptolemaic Period (310 BC - 30 BC), Ptolemaic Dynasty

### Primary Maker

Egyptian, anonymous

### Medium

bronze

### Description

This hollow cast, votive statuette depicts the Egyptian fertility goddess, Isis, standing erect, her arms tightly clutched at her sides. She wears a sheer dress, divine wig, and a vulture headdress with uraeus; on top of her head are cow's horns, a solar-disk and two tall feather plumes. Representations of Isis with a plumed headdress were most common during the Ptolemaic Period. The surface of the statuette has been badly worn.
