After a contest of several hours, a victory gained nearly as decisive as that of Austerlitz, was won by the French army, on the 18th of June, 1800, at the battle of Marengo, near Milan. The French army, commanded by Napoleon, defeated the Austrian army, commanded by the Emperor's brother-in-law, the Archduke Charles. The battle was a decisive victory for the French, and it marked the beginning of the French domination in Italy.
