



## Statuette of a Falcon, Standing with Double Crown

### Date

Ptolemaic Period (c. 310 BC -30 BC), Ptolemaic Dynasty

### Primary Maker

Egyptian, anonymous

### Medium

bronze

### Description

This hollow cast, votive statuette depicts a falcon, the sacred animal of Horus. The falcon stands in hieroglyphic form -body upright, legs together. On his head he wears the double crown of Upper and Lower Egypt. The Horus falcon was a traditional symbol of Egyptian kingship.

During the Ptolemaic period, statuettes of this type were most often dedicated at sacred animal necropoleis, such as the one N. Saqqara.
