Belaire at Los Angeles NYP meetings have stated that the NYP is studying every revolution that has ever occurred. The NYP then adopts those parts of the various revolutions which best suit their cause. The example is on the Chinese Revolution of Mao Tse-tung. Comments are made to the effect of "ten generations of Keanoyes could not eat all the food they could buy; and that is not bad"; the "rich in America have too much"; and the "Communist way is the way". A

At a Los Angeles NYP meeting held on the night of October 9, 1968, it was decided to organize a NYP patrol, similar to the one in existence in the Oakland, California, area. Four or five of the younger NYP members are to patrol the black community and observe the police in action. When they see a police car stop a black person, and draw his gun, they are supposed to train their guns on the policemen. This patrol is supposed to start on October 11, 1968. Only those male members too young to have qualified for the Los Angeles Police Department Academy are being chosen to serve on the patrol. This is an attempt to keep informants from being assigned to the patrol. A

On October 12 - 13, 1968, members of the Los Angeles NYP were going to picket the ABC Market, while others were going to conduct a door-to-door survey at the same time in an attempt to gather evidence of malpractice against the market. Possibly the ABC Market at 55th Street and Main would be the one to be picketed. U

The Los Angeles NYP picketed the ABC market over the weekend of October 12 - 13, 1968, but only about five members participated in the picketing while four to five other members contacted people living in the immediate vicinity of the market in an attempt to obtain their signatures on a petition accusing the market of unfair hiring practices, poor service, and bad quality merchandise.
